

## BEING FULLY COMMITTED TO JESUS

What He requires is the cross. The way of the cross is the way of death.

As a disciple, we must carry our own cross, we must die to our own desires in order to live for Christ.

We must count the cost of following Jesus, we must be committed.

We must be salty, we must maintain our flavor and not lose our saltiness.

Being a disciple is not an option but rather an obligation.

One cannot separate salvation from discipleship.

Salvation is NOT CHEAP, it cost Jesus everything and it will cost us everything too!

Being committed is the way of the cross and it's being willing to die to anything that would get in the way of your relationship with Jesus.

To experience new life in Christ, we have to participate in His death. Become the living dead.

There is tremendous liberty in the death of self, in that death we become like Him.

The things of the world loose their attraction.
